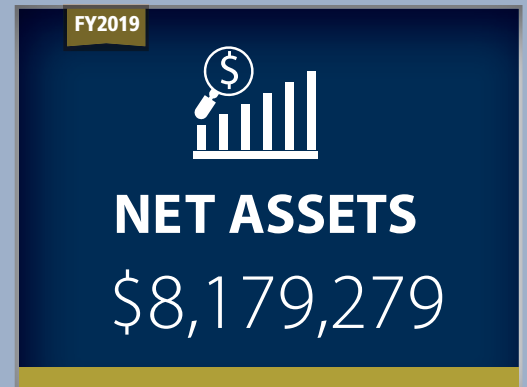
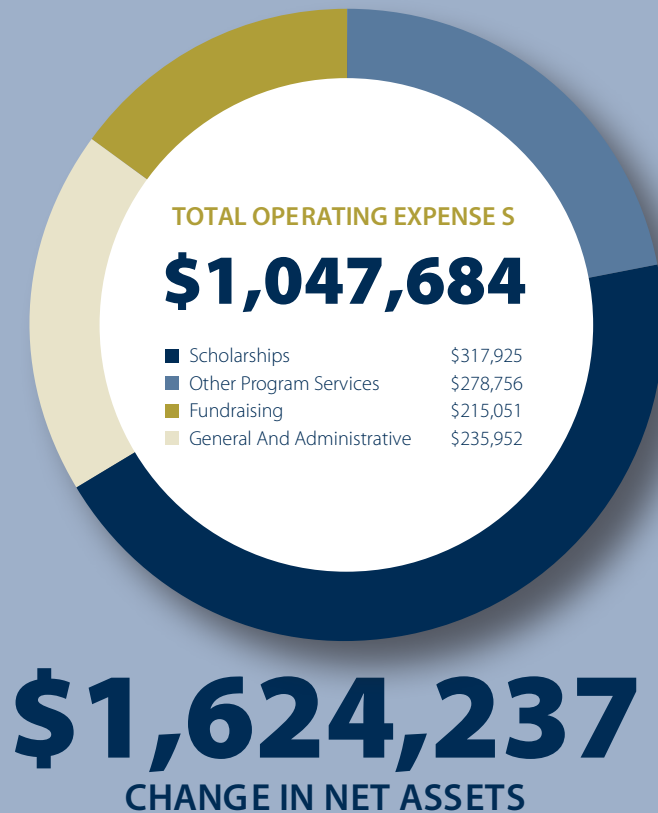

Opportunities for Funding Perpetual Scholarships

Perpetual Honor Scholarship

Funded at \$150,000 and payable over five years or less.

A Perpetual Honor Scholarship will provide for an annual scholarship to be awarded in perpetuity to the top student for each application pool. The value of each scholarship will be \$1,500/year higher than that established for Perpetual General Named Scholarships, and will be awarded for four years to the most deserving student(s) each year.

Perpetual General Named Scholarship

Funded at \$120,000 and payable over five years or less.

A Perpetual General Named Scholarship will provide for an annual scholarship in perpetuity for a four-year, two-year or Career and Technical Education (CTE) scholarship as the donor designates. As of 2019 the annual scholarship award amount is \$3,500 per year.

Shared Perpetual General Named Scholarship

Funded at \$60,000 and payable over five years or less.

A perpetual Shared Named Scholarship will provide for an annual scholarship in perpetuity for a four-year, two-year or Career and Technical Education (CTE) scholarship as you designate. Other scholarship funds will also be awarded to the same student to fully fund the annual scholarship. As of 2019 the annual scholarship award amount is \$3,500 per year.
